## Guerrero Olivos appoints five new partners in Chile

Guerrero Olivos has promoted five lawyers to partner, strengthening its labour, corporate, banking and finance, and water law practices.

Rocío García de la Pastora, 41, Josefina Yávar, 36, Tomás Kubick, 35, Benjamín Pérez, 39 and Miguel Coddou, 53, joined the partnership on 1 January. The Chilean firm now has 18 partners.

García de la Pastora is partner in the firm's labour, migration and employment practice. She joined the firm in 2017 after 14 years advising at García de la Pastora Abogados' labour practice in Santiago.

Yávar and Kubick form part of the corporate and M&A practice and both began their legal careers at Guerrero Olivos. Yávar heads the venture capital department while Kubick focuses on consumer protection.

Another home-grown talent, Pérez co-heads the water law practice. The fifth newly made partner, Coddou, practises in the banking and finance group.

Firm managing partner Juan Enrique Allard says the firm is proud to offer senior positions to talented lawyers who have built their careers at the firm. "They have positioned themselves as leaders in their respective areas," he says.

Allard says the promotions focus on areas that have seen substantial growth recently, such as labour and migration, which are increasingly becoming two independent practices, while also strengthening traditional practices like banking and finance and M&A. With his expertise in water law, Pérez will be a useful asset to the firm's mining group, Allard adds.
